Message from the President:

Well! The trip to Crooked Tree was an adventure from the start. Unbeknownst to DSWPS and the Scarab Club, the Charles Wright Museum was hosting a charity walk for Sickle Cell Anemia at the same time as the art drop-off. All roads to the Scarab Club were closed and manned by the DPD. All side streets from Woodward to Brush and Kirby to Warren were blocked off! We had to wait until the walk ended at 11:00. Needless to say I had a flurry of phone calls between 10 and 11 am. Thankfully, two of my sisters were there to assist me, and we packed up and hit the road by noon. After experiencing two 'gully washers' near Gaylord, we parked the truck in front of Crooked Tree to see a 'CLOSED due to Power Outage' sign. After a moment of panic, the director, who happened to be at the door, helped me unpack the artwork while my sisters unloaded the truck. We were finished by suppertime. Whew!

The show will be up until November 19th. If you are in the Petoskey area befoe the close, please stop by to see the exhibit - it is a beautiful display -- tell your friends. Also, I will be giving a talk promoting our Society and retelling its history at the Crooked Tree Art Center on Tuesday, October 18th. We will be part of their lecture series 'Coffee at Ten'.

Our last exhibit for 2016 will be our 'Recent Work' at the Loft Fine Art Gallery in Mt. Clemens. I expect we will see some of your great work produced this summer. The big day is Saturday, October 1st. At the gallery (81 Macomp Place near the Anton Art Center) from 10 am to noon, members will bring in their art, fill out entry forms, pay their \$30 entry fee and sign-in to the entry log. At noon, most of us will be having hunch at Bath City Bistro (a few doors away) while the jury process transpires. Afterward, only the declined artwork will be removed. Accepted artwork will remain at the gallery. 'Easy-peasy' - a one -stop process.

If you wish to be included in the chicken buffet lunch at Bath City Bistro, reserve your place by contacting Deborah Benedic at deborah.benedic62@gmail.com - or the Loft Fine Art Gallery at 586-213-5800. You will pay Deb Benedic \$18 (includes tax and tip) with cash or check (made out to Deb Benedic) on October 1st at the drop off. Vegetarian and gluten-free entrées are available upon request when you reserve your place.

This 'Recent Work' exhibition will run from October 5th to October 19th. Two entries are allowed for the \$30 entry fee (separately framed pieces considered a diptych constitute 2 entries). The commission to the Loft will be 35% so price your work accordingly. Juror: Adnan Charara. Reception: Saturday, October 8th, 3 - 5 pm. Pickup dates: October 20th 3 - 6 pm or October 21st 12 - 3 pm.

Our October 20th General Meeting will be at the Spicer House in Heritage Park in Farmington Hills. Bring a bag lunch and your art materials for a fabulous plein-aire opportunity with your DSWPS friends. See move details in this newsletter (right column page 1 and right column page 2). A portable chair if you like to sit while you work

A portable easel or table

A portable kit of your paints or drawing supplies

Brushes, pencils, pastels, palette knives, etc, to paint with

Something to paint ON (paper, canvas, panel, etc.)

Paper towels

Small trash bag for soiled paper towels

A carrier to transport your finished or semi-finished artwork home Water to drink

Camera

Dress in layers ,including a light wind breaker, that you can add or remove as needed.

If you have questions about what to bring, feel welcome to contact me.

Check the weather report before you come so you will have an idea of what clothing to bring. We'll be outdoors in the warmer part of the day. We will discuss plein air painting and answer questions at the meeting.

Minutes of General Meeting, September 22, 2016 - Detroit Yacht Club

President Jackie Rybinski called the meeting to order at 11:21 am. Thirty-eight members and guests were present at the Detroit Yacht Club.

Recording Secretary Carolyn Sherwood read the minutes of the May, 2016 meeting. The motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Marilyn Bomarito and supported by Kathleen McNamee. Motion carried.

President's Communication: President Jackie Rybinski thanked former president Kathy O'Connell for her help in making the transition to the leadership position a smooth one. The president also commended Jan Ducsay for getting the directory ready for distribution at the September meeting.

After welcoming guests and new members the president commented on some of the obstacles encountered in picking up art at the Scarab Club and delivering it to the Crooked Tree Gallery in Petoskey, MI. They involved blocked streets in Detroit because of a run and a power outage in Petoskey due to thunderstorms.

As part of the DSWPS show at Crooked Tree Gallery, the president will give a talk on the history of DSWPS to attendees of the gallery's 'Coffee at Ten' program.

Treasurer Marilyn Bomarito reported the treasury balance as of May 31, 2016. After summer activity the final balance as of August 30, 2016 was reported. The motion to receive and file the report was made by Carolyn Sherwood with support from Arlene Oakland.

Corresponding Secretary Joyce Manke informed the members that the newsletter would go out the following week. She suggested that members might want to check out the website Cafe Call for Entry.

First VP Programs Chris Unwin reported that the artist Debbi LaPratt would talk about her clay work that incorporates the architectural artifacts of Detroit. Kathy O'Connell informed the membership that the October 20 meeting would be held at Heritage Park in Farmington. The meeting will take place at the Spicer House. The program is an afternoon of painting. Detailed information will be in the newsletter. Sue Jaeger suggested that we return in the spring and perhaps paint in the same location that was chosen for the autumn painting.

Second VP Exhibitions: Rose Rhodes, exhibition committee member, discussed the arrangements for the show in Mount Clemens at The Loft. Entry form will be filled out and entry fee paid when art is delivered on October 1 from 10 am until Noon. A buffet lunch will be available at Bath City Bistro (\$18.00) at Noon. The juror is Adnan Charara. A commission of 35% will be taken. There will be a reception from 3-5 pm on October 8. Please check the newsletter for more recent updates. As of the meeting pick-up dates are October 20 and 21.

The Starkweather Gallery show will take place October, 2017. Jan Filarski is the chairperson for this exhibition. MOCAD show at the Kelly Homestead has been scheduled for February through April, 2017.

Tracy Irwin and Debra Benedic are co-chairing this event. This show will involve active participation of the membership.

Third VP Directory Jan Ducsay thanked Arlene Oakland for her input as Jan began the process of compiling data and planning the layout of the directory. Two hundred directories were printed. Jan advised the members that there was a slight change in format.

Historian Julie Sabit reported that she had checked the names in the resume book with the membership list. Fifty-seven members are not represented in the book. Jan Ducsay offered to mail the resume form with the directory. Kathy O'Connell suggested that we have a list of all members, present and past.

Membership Jan Ducsay reported a current membership of 141. At the time of mailing renewal there was a count of 149. Seventeen members chose not to renew and nine new members were added to the organization. Jan welcomed back the members in attendance. To those who expressed an interest in working on membership committee, Jan suggested that they meet over lunch after the meeting.

Webmaster Kathleen McNamee asked that members send information to her for the website.

Global Art Project co-chairs Carol LaChiusa and Beverly Zimmerman: The artwork from our partner group in England was displayed. Those members who took part were allowed to choose a piece of art.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:30pm.
